Camras Scholarship

Full-tuition scholarship based on the tuition rates of the student's first year

The same amount is awarded each consecutive year and does not cover the cost of a tuition increase. Students are eligible for up to four years of undergraduate tuition; five years if the student is in the architecture program.

Named for Marvin Camras (EE '40, M.S. '42)—an Illinois Tech alumnus who was a pioneer of magnetic recording—the Camras Scholarship is a prestigious award given to the top applicants to the university each year. The amount awarded for the scholarship is equal to the cost of tuition for the year in which it is awarded, and will be valued at more than \$175,000 over four years.

Requirements: Camras Scholarship recipients are an integral part of the campus community as outlined by the pillars of the scholarship program: leadership, service, and research. No separate application is required!

Duchossois Scholarship

Full-tuition and room and board scholarship

Recipients will be provided a full-tuition scholarship for undergraduate study at Illinois Tech for up to four years, or for up to five years for students pursuing architecture or an accelerated master's program degree. This award also covers room and board expenses for students living in on-campus residence halls or fraternity/sorority housing. Additional benefits include a fully funded summer educational experience led by a Duchossois Leadership Professor in the summers after the students' first, second, and third years; leadership retreats; and faculty and peer mentoring. Made possible by the Duchossois Family Foundation, this award requires recipients to demonstrate exceptional leadership potential and academic success in their projected fields.

Requirements: Duchossois Leadership Scholars must live on campus for their first two years. Recipients are expected to participate in the program's activities and to maintain good academic and personal standing at the university by maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or higher. An integral goal of this program is the development of leaders who have a passion for service and making an impact on their communities; in line with this mission, students will sign a letter of intent to make annual \$100 donations to the university upon graduation. A separate scholarship application is required.

Leadership Academy Scholarship

Full-tuition scholarship based on the tuition rates of the student's first year

The same amount is awarded each consecutive year and does not cover the cost of a tuition increase. Students are eligible for up to four years of undergraduate tuition; five years if the student is in the architecture program.

Named for University Regent Al Self and his wife, Lila, the M.A. and Lila Self Leadership Academy Scholarship is a distinguished award given to top applicants that demonstrate exceptional leadership potential.

Requirements: Open to full-time undergraduate students, recipients must attend all Leadership Academy-sponsored programs, including, but not limited to, Saturday leadership seminars, regular scholar meetings, and leadership retreats, as well as maintain a 3.0 grade-point average. Leadership Academy scholars are required to actively participate in a committee of their choosing to support development of the Leadership Academy program, and contribute 10 hours of service to community-service projects that are officially sponsored by the Leadership Academy. A separate scholarship application is required.
