Embodying over 375 years of traditions and values, the Army National Guard has played an integral role in our nation's history and development. In the early 1600's, fellow citizens banded together in Salem, Massachusetts, to defend against attacks, forming a militia that became known as the National Guard. The



Citizen-Soldier's role was further defined in 1903, when national legislation recognized the National Guard as a reserve force for the U.S. Army. The Army National Guard's presence from the Revolutionary War to current conflicts further establishes our position as a vital military component.
