produced record results without our retailer partners, and they earned more than \$139 million in commissions and incentives this past year for selling and redeeming Lottery tickets.

While it's great to help K-12 public education by playing the Lottery, we understand it's even better to win – and our players did a lot of winning this past year. All the prizes won by our players in FY21 added up to a record \$2.2 billion. In fact, about 67 cents of every dollar spent on a Lottery ticket in Virginia in FY21 went back to players as prizes.

If we learned anything in FY21, it's that nothing is certain. The pandemic caused a world of changes to the way we live our lives and interact with each other. But what hasn't changed is that the Virginia Lottery provides millions of winning moments that allow our players to imagine what's possible through a variety of fun and entertaining experiences. What's even better is this: All of it helps generate needed resources to support Virginia's K-12 public schools.

A MESSAGE FROM

One perk of my job as executive director of the Virginia Lottery is presenting those big souvenir checks to lucky Lottery winners.

This past year, the biggest winners of all were Virginia's K-12 public schools: The Lottery handed over a check for a record-breaking \$766 million in profits. By law, every penny of Lottery profits must be spent on K-12 public school programs.

Thanks to our loyal players and retailer partners, the 12-month period from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, was the most significant and successful in the Virginia Lottery's 33-year history. In a year marked by concerns about the pandemic and lots of economic uncertainty, the Virginia Lottery focused like a laser on our mission of generating funds for education.

Sales of all Virginia Lottery games for FY21 reached a record \$3.26 billion, which is a 52-percent increase over the previous year.

The biggest reason for that remarkable performance was the introduction of online Lottery games on July 1. Giving our consumers the ability to play their favorite Lottery games anytime, anywhere made a huge difference, and online Lottery sales topped more than \$800 million in the first year.

As impressive as that is, most Virginia Lottery sales take place at more than 5,300 retail businesses across Virginia. We could not have

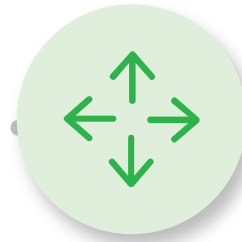
