"College students need GOOD community, and campus ministries offer that. What better group than those who have been through the challenges of college life and are going through it right beside you!



Erskine competes dually on the intercollegiate level as a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II as a member of Conference Carolinas and as a member of the National Christian College Athletics Association (NCCAA). The College currently offers 24 sports: men's and women's basketball, golf, indoor track and field, outdoor track

and field, soccer, and volleyball; men's baseball and football; women's cross country, lacrosse, softball, and beach volleyball; acrobatics and tumbling, bass fishing, esports, rodeo, cheer, and dance.

The Flying Fleet has won 23 conference championships in the past 13 years. While success is important at Erskine, winning the right way counts most. Erskine Athletics serves as a training ground for character and sportsmanship. 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
At Erskine, our athletes strive to excel in academics as well as in sports.

First-time freshman applicants who have not acquired more than 24 credit hours at a college or university.

Application checklist for first-time freshmen:

- Apply
- Official high school transcript (completed junior year/showing senior classes)
- Official ACT, SAT, or CLT* scores

As soon as your application package is complete, we will make an admission decision on a rolling basis. Once admitted, you simply submit an enrollment fee to reserve a place in the incoming class. Enrollment fees are accepted only while space is still available for the class.

*Erskine College is accepting the Classical Learning Test (CLT) as one of our options for the required standardized test score needed for freshman admission.

INTERNATIONAL

Students who are not U.S. Citizens.

Application checklist for international students:

- Apply
- Submit the SAT
- Submit transcript (must be translated into a U.S. 4.0 grading scale and should go through SpanTran, IEE, ECE, or another NACES member). If using SpanTran, choose the course-by-course evaluation. If using IEE, choose the course report that pertains to your education background (high school only or high school + post-secondary). If using ECE, use the course-by-course evaluation. This will allow us to receive the transcript evaluation and the student's official transcript. We will need both documents to proceed with admission. For other organizations, please reach out to our office for help selecting the correct evaluation method.
- Submit proof of English proficiency: English proficiency is required when a student's native language is not English. Accepted exams and scores: TOEFL: 70 iBT (internet-based test), PTE Academic: 48, and IELTS: 6.0.

Once admitted, you simply submit an enrollment fee to reserve a place in the incoming class. Enrollment fees are accepted only while space is still available for the class. The enrollment fee and all ancillary documents, such as certificate of finance and official evaluated transcripts, must be submitted before the I-20 process can start.

TRANSFER

High school graduates who have enrolled at a college or university and have (or will have) 24 credit hours accrued upon enrolling at Erskine.


Application checklist for transfer students:

- Apply
- Official college transcripts from all institutions attended
- Official high school transcript **
- Official ACT, SAT, or CLT scores **
- ** These items are required under the following circumstances: (1) You have below a 2.0 GPA in college (2) You have completed fewer than 24 hours of college work, or (3) You graduated from high school in the state of South Carolina.

As soon as your application package is complete, we will make an admission decision on a rolling basis. Once admitted, you simply submit an enrollment fee to reserve a place in the incoming class. Enrollment fees are accepted only while space is still available for the class.

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Erskine College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to award baccalaureate, masters, and doctorate degrees.
