


### **Applied Behavior Analysis**

MA in Applied Behavior Analysis



As a Behavior Analyst, you will study the science of behavior in order to inform individualized therapy practices for a variety of populations, and to serve individuals, groups, and school systems. Many people work with children and adolescents with autism spectrum disorder or other developmental disabilities. The principles of behavior analysis can be applied in many different work settings including classrooms, community-based agencies, in-home/residential treatment, clinics, hospitals, and even business.

The Master of Arts in Applied Behavior Analysis at William James College is designed to meet the growing need for practitioners who are knowledgeable about the principles of behavior and skilled in the development, implementation, and evaluation of behavioral interventions. With your training, you will help individuals improve their social, communication, academic and other skills to help foster independence and enhance daily life.

Upon completion of the program, you will meet the coursework requirements to take the Board Certified Behavior Analyst exam. If you are not currently working in an ABA setting where you can receive the mentored training to meet the fieldwork requirements for the exam, you have the option to take 5 additional credits and obtain an individualized field placement.

The Association for Behavior Analysis International has verified our courses toward the coursework requirements for eligibility to take the Board Certified Behavior Analyst<sup>®</sup> or Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst® examination. Applicants will need to meet additional requirements before they can be deemed eligible to take the examination. This means that our students can take the exam to become a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) without an additional coursework review by ABAI. Contingent upon passing the exam, graduates can also become licensed in Applied Behavior Analysis in many states (a separate application applies). Many jobs, particularly those that involve supervisory roles, require the BCBA certification and/or licensure in ABA. This is an important outcome to consider for any graduate program in Applied Behavior Analysis.
