

- Frequent contact with home through technology, letters, phone calls, visits, emails, and breaks





Selection for admission

Milton Hershey School enrolls students from across the United States.

To be considered for enrollment, a child must:

- · Come from a low-income family
- Be 4-15 years old at the time of enrollment
- · Have the ability to learn
- Be free from serious behavioral problems likely to disrupt the classroom or student home life at MHS
- Have the ability to participate in and benefit from the MHS program

While MHS believes all children deserve the very best education, the school is not right for every child, even if they meet the minimum requirements for age and family income. Some children may not adjust to the school's unique student home environment or may have behavioral issues that could be disruptive. Other children may need services that are beyond what the school provides as part of its program.
