A MESSAGE FROM Kelly Gee EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

One of the key characteristics of all the most successful businesses is the ability to be nimble. In the face of adversity, can you continue to provide innovative solutions, maintain a high level of responsiveness to customers and cultivate a workforce that thrives? The past year has brought about changes to the broader economy and more competition in the gaming space. As our Fiscal Year 2022 results show, the Virginia Lottery has again persevered and performed to impressive heights in the face of challenges during the past year.

Virginia Lottery sales in FY22 totaled more than \$3.75 billion. That record amount was generated from ticket sales at more than 5,300 retail businesses across Virginia and online at valottery.com. Lottery retailers are our partners in offering games, and, in FY22, those Virginia Lottery retailers earned \$138.6 million in commissions and bonuses.

Approximately 71 cents of every dollar spent by Virginia Lottery players on tickets goes right back to those players as prizes. In FY22, we awarded more than \$2.67 billion in prize money, which included 38 tickets that won prizes of \$1 million or greater.

The biggest winner of all was K-12 education. While Lottery funds are just one slice of the larger education-funding pie, our efforts resulted in record profits of \$779.6 million.

When I was appointed Executive Director of the Virginia Lottery in January 2022, my previous experience within the Lottery showed me the unique place this organization

Virginia Lottery Sales

With each purchase of a Lottery game, you contribute to Virginia's future and help the Lottery live its mission.



Lottery Proceeds Fund

The Lottery deposits 100% of profits from the sale of games into the Lottery Proceeds Fund, which is designated by the Constitution of Virginia to support local public education across the Commonwealth of Virginia.



Virginia Department of Education

VDOE distributes all education funding, including the Lottery Proceeds Fund dollars, to school divisions across Virginia. Distribution is based on the approved state budget and other factors that include student enrollment and prioritized programs.



Virginia's Public School Divisions

Each school division allocates funds to its schools.
