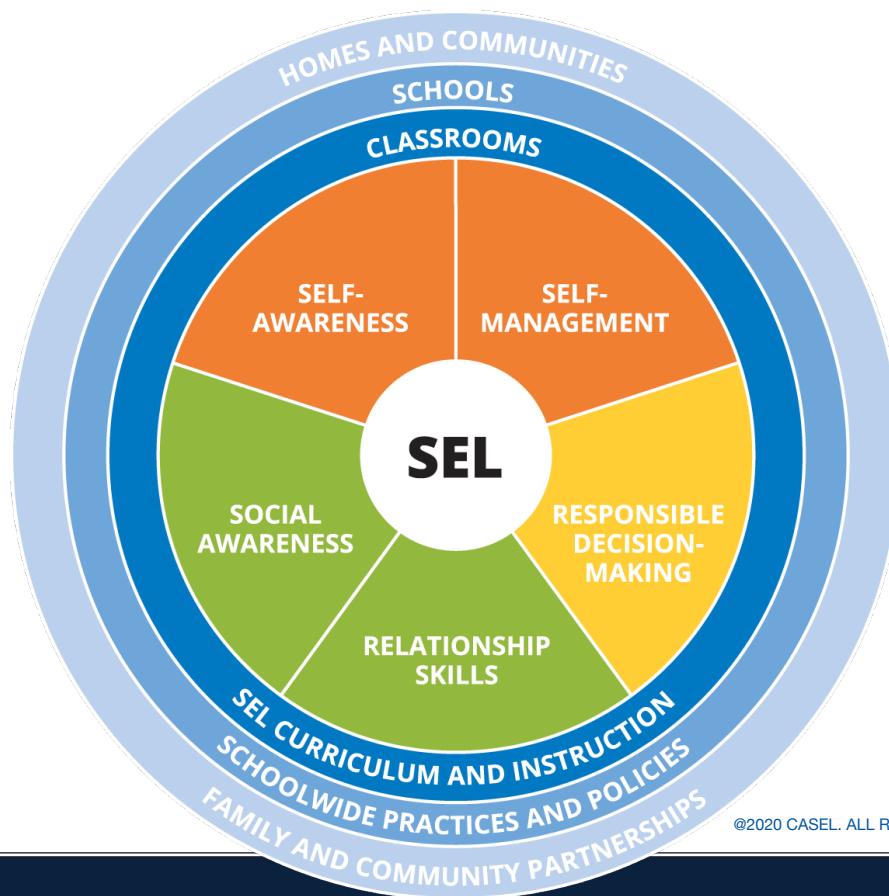

Self-Awareness:

The abilities to understand one's own emotions, thoughts, and values and how they influence behavior across contexts.



Self-management:

The abilities to manage one's emotions, thoughts, and behaviors effectively in different situations and to achieve goals and aspirations.



Social awareness:

The abilities to understand the perspectives of and empathize with others, including those from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and contexts.



Relationship skills:

The abilities to establish and maintain healthy and supportive relationships and to effectively navigate settings with diverse individuals and groups.



Responsible decision-making:

The abilities to make caring and constructive choices about personal behavior and social interactions across diverse situations.

FAQs

Q: Do all facilitator's need a curriculum?

Each person facilitating the program should have an Individual Teachers' License. There is a separate license for each grade level PreK-8. The high school license contains all levels, grades 9-12.

Q: Do I need to teach the lessons in order?

It is best if the lessons within a unit are taught in order. PreK-8 Units 1-3 cover the core SEL skills and contain 18 lessons. Unit 4 (Prevention) and Unit 5 (Service-Learning) are optional. Unit 6 is Reflection and Closure. If time is limited it is possible to cover the SEL skills in 18-20 lessons.

Q: What is the difference between the PreK-8 and the high school curriculum?

The PreK-8 program offers 20 SEL lessons, 8 Prevention lessons, and 8 Service-learning lessons. The high school program offers 16 SEL lessons at each grade level and a separate Service-learning Manual with 18 lessons.

Q: Is it the same lesson every year?

No, the topics of the lessons are the same every year, but the lessons are unique.



Q: Is the curriculum available in print?

The curriculum is no longer available entirely in print. You may purchase the online edition + a print copy of the lesson plans (*Facilitator's Resource Guide*). If you currently use the print program, you may purchase additional print Student Journals.

Q: May I print the online lessons?

Yes, the lesson plans are now printable. If you would also like a print copy of the lessons order the Print + Online Edition. (The *Student Journal* activities and *Family Connection* activities are writable/printable pdfs.)

Q: Is there a Student Edition?

No. All the material, including the *Student Journal* activities and *Family Connection* activities are accessed and distributed by the teacher/facilitator as writable/printable pdfs.

Q: May the online edition be shared by instructors?

No. The Online Edition is intended for use by an individual instructor. It may be accessed from up to 3 different devices by that instructor. Each person facilitating the program should have their own individual license.

Q: Is there a pre/post evaluation?

Yes, the pre/post student survey is included with the program (grades 3-12).

Professional Development

With a network of experienced trainers across the country Lions Quest offers SEL professional development workshops targeted to the role each staff member plays in the implementation of the program. Virtual and In-person workshops are capped at 40 people and scheduled to fit your school day. Follow-up workshops are always available at your request.

LIONS QUEST WORKSHOPS

Live Virtual Workshop

The Lions Quest Virtual Workshop is designed to provide implementers support in the development of the social and emotional competence of students in grades Pre-K-12 through the Lions Quest program. Each workshop is 2 ½ hours with a maximum attendance of 40.

The webinar provides a high-level overview of the program resources and includes three breakout sessions for collaboration.



In-person Workshop

Lions Quest offers 1-day or 2-day in-person workshop which are held at your location, capped at 40 attendees, and scheduled to fit your school day.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FAQs

Q: Is training required?

Training is not required but is recommended, especially for schoolwide or larger implementations.

Q: Who should attend the training?

Besides the staff who will be directly facilitating the program other staff members who will support the program are welcome to attend including administrators and principals, implementation coaches, teacher's assistants, etc.

Q: Are there additional fees to cover travel expenses, etc.?

There are no additional fees. It is a flat rate, one-time fee.

Q: Is there a Training of Trainer (TOT) program?

Lions Quest offers schools, districts, and organizations a TOT program to help ensure program sustainability.
