### **The Ithaca Commitment**

The Ithaca Commitment empowers you and your family to choose IC with confidence and support. Proactive and student centered, the Ithaca Commitment includes our Four-Year Financial Forecast and Increase Cap, streamlined financial aid process, and IC Advantage—free online summer courses for incoming students.

### **Your Four-Year Financial Forecast and Increase Cap**

After you apply for financial aid, IC provides you and your family with a clear, detailed, four-year overview of your expected college costs and financial aid—including a specified cap on combined costs for tuition, room, board, and fees. That way, you and your family can understand and plan for the maximum direct costs of an IC education, from start to finish, before you enroll.


### **Your Streamlined Financial Aid Process**

We've done our best to make the financial aid process at IC simple and easy to understand. All you need to do to get the maximum financial aid for which you qualify is to submit either the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) if you are a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, or the IC Financial Aid Application if you are not a U.S. citizen.

### **IC Advantage Online Summer Courses**

Because we want you to get the most out of your college education, IC offers one free one-credit IC Advantage course to all incoming students the summer before their first semester at Ithaca. In addition to mastering course content, students become familiar with IC's academic expectations and get to know professors and other students.





# Transparency You Deserve



### We Partner with You

In 2022, IC provided more than \$38 million to incoming students, who received between \$16,000 and \$50,000 each in annually renewable IC scholarships and grants. (Amounts were calculated on the basis of merit and financial need.) Through scholarships, scholar programs, grants, work study, student employment, or any combination of these, you and Ithaca College can finance your IC education in a variety of ways. If you are offered admission and apply for financial aid, you will be invited to schedule an individual appointment with our financial aid experts to discuss what's right for you and your family.

### **Determining Your Need**

Ithaca College is an investment in who you can be and what you can do in the world. Once you submit your application for financial aid, we use the following formula to calculate your financial need:

### COA - EFC = Your Financial Need

### **DEFINITION OF TERMS**

**Cost of Attendance (COA):** This includes total direct costs (such as tuition, housing, dining) for which Ithaca College will bill you and costs most students have but that IC will not bill you for (such as books, personal expenses).

**Expected Family Contribution (EFC):** This is calculated based on the information you submit in your financial aid application. It is an estimate—not the actual amount—you will have to pay.

### **Aid for Your Ithaca College Education**

### **Scholarships**

A scholarship is money you don't have to pay back. Every student admitted to Ithaca College is automatically considered for a merit scholarship. Additional scholarships may be based on need and/or may be awarded by external organizations.

### **Grants**

Like scholarships, grants are money you don't have to pay back. Analysis of your financial aid application will determine your eligibility for grants from the federal government, Ithaca College, and New York State (if you are a New York State resident).

### **Scholar Programs**

Scholar programs offer value through focused experiences; some include an annually renewable scholarship.

- Leadership Scholar Program (\$7,000 annual scholarship)
- MLK Scholar Program (up to \$30,000 annual scholarship)
- Park Scholar Program (full cost of attending Ithaca College)

### Loans

A loan is money you receive to help pay for college that you must pay back with interest. You may be eligible for government loans or loans from private lenders, including banks.
