

The Credentialing Assistance (CA) Program provides Soldiers with funding for more than 1,600 credentials listed on www.cool.osd.mil/army

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

- Complete AIT, WOBC, or BOLC
- Not be flagged
- Military Service Obligation (MSO):
 - · Enlisted: Complete credential prior to separation/ETS
 - Officers/Warrant Officers: Incur a service obligation after their last day of the course - 2 Yrs for active duty Soldiers (ADSO) or 4 Ys for RC Soldiers (RDSO)
 - Officers/Warrant Officers do not incur a service obligation for Testing or Recertification (capped at \$2,000 on their last year of service)

WHAT DO I GET?

- Up to \$4,000/year to pay for a new credential or recertification (combined use of FTA and CA cannot exceed \$4,000 per FY)
- A maximum of \$1,000/year to pay for selected aviation related credentials (Active Duty/AGR Soldiers only)
- CA pays expenses for course materials/supplies, textbooks, and exam fees
- CA can be used for any credential listed on www.cool.osd.mil/ army and does not have to be related to the Soldier's MOS
- All expenses are paid prior to course/exam start date
 - Soldiers who pay out of pocket will not be reimbursed














An education program for Service Members who serve on active duty after September 10, 2001.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

Serve at least 90 days in a period of qualifying active duty on or after September 11, 2001:

- Title 10 USC Sections 688, 12301(a), 12301(d), 12301(g), 12301(h), 12302, 12304, 12304a, or 12304b
- . Title 10 AGR or Title 32 AGR
- Title 32 USC, Section 502(f) as follows:
 - Operation Noble Eagle: September 11, 2001 May 31, 2002
 - Southwest Border (Operation Guardian Shield): February 15, 2019 – January 20, 2021
 - COVID-19 Pandemic Response: March 22, 2020 December 31, 2021
 - Capitol Police (59th Inauguration): January 11, 2021- May 23, 2021
- Serve for 30 continuous days and separate due to a serviceconnected disability or injury

WHAT DO I GET?

- Tuition and Fees:
 - . Up to 100% of in-state tuition at public schools
 - Up to \$26,042.81/year at private or foreign schools
- . Books and Supply Stipend:
 - Up to \$1,000/academic year (\$41.67/ credit hour)
- . Monthly Housing Allowance (MHA):
 - · Equal to BAH rate—E5 with dependents
 - . \$871 if attending only online classes
- Payments pro-rated base on your qualifying service:
 - 36 Months = 100% (Includes Purple Heart Recipients)
 - 30 Months = 90%
 - 24 Months = 80%
 - 18 Months = 70%
 - 6 Months = 60%
 - 90 Days = 50%



An incentive for continued service offered to Service Members who qualify for the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

I QUALIFY? HOW DO

- Be currently serving in the Uniformed Services, with at least six years completed
- · Qualify for the Post-9/11 GI Bill at any payment tier
- NOT be flagged for adverse action, ACFT/ABCP failure, or as Unsatisfactory Participant
- · Agree to a four-year service obligation from the date of your transfer request

NOTE: IF YOU VOLUNTARILY SEPARATE FROM THE ARNG PRIOR TO COMPLETING YOUR OED, YOUR TEB WILL BE TERMINATED AND ANY FUNDS PAID TO YOUR DEPENDENTS WILL BE RECOUPED!

WHAT DO I GET?

- Dependents receive same payment tier as the Soldier
- · Spouses may use transferred benefits immediately
- · Child/Children:
 - · Cannot use the benefit until transferring Soldier has completed 10 years in the Armed Forces
- · Can begin using the benefit on their 18th birthday or upon high school graduation, whichever comes first
- · Eligibility ends on their 26th birthday unless an earlier date is specified
- · Natural, step children, adopted children and wards and foster children who have lived with the SM for 12 months are eligible
- You can modify and/or revoke months for any dependents you originally transferred month of benefits to - even after you separate from service
- IMPORTANT!

You must be currently serving to add a new dependent

HOW DO I APPLY?

- Step 1: Contact the VA at 1-888-GIBILL-1 to determine the number of months of benefits you have remaining
- Step 2: Complete extension (if required)
- Step 3: Got to Milconnect and complete your TEB application at: https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect/
- Step 4: Access your Enterprise Email and follow email instructions
- Step 5: Apply for benefits
- When ready to attend school, your approved dependent(s) apply at: www.va.gov
- Notify the VA Certifying Official at your school to certify your enrollment



APT is comprised of standardized tests used to determine eligibility for specialized training and to support the Army's personnel selection and classification process, including language proficiency testing.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

Be an active drilling member of the ARNG

WHAT DO I GET?

With APT, Soldiers can take the following tests at no charge to enhance your military career:

ARMED FORCES CLASSIFICATION TEST (AFCT):

 Raise GT/Line Scores to Re-class MOS or qualify for Officer Candidate School

SELECTION INSTRUMENT FLIGHT TRAINING (SIFT):

Qualify for Aviation School

LANGUAGE TESTS (DLPT, DLAB, OPI):

Qualify for Foreign Language Billets & Proficiency bonuses

HOW DO I APPLY?

To schedule an APT exam, contact your unit, obtain a DA Form 4187 (Request for Personnel Action), signed by the Unit Commander and submit to your state Test Control Officer (TCO).

A document approved by the American Council on Education (ACE) to validate a service member's military occupational experience and training along with the corresponding ACE college credit recommendations.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

All Military Members, current or former, are eligible to receive a JST.

WHAT DO I GET?

- The JST helps college registrars award college credit for learning gained in the military
- The JST provides a description of military schooling and work history in civilian language and serves as a counseling tool for academic and career counselors in advising Service members and veterans
- The JST saves time and money by recommending the award of college credits, which means less tuition to pay and less time spent in the classroom
- The acceptance of ACE credit recommendations varies depending on an institution's policies, procedures, and degree requirements



- If you are missing an ACE-accredited course that you completed more than two months ago, send a copy of all training certificate documentation (DA-1059) and justification through the JST website



A combination of on-the-job training (OJT) and related classroom instruction provided under the supervision of a trade professional, journeyman-level, or craftsman in which workers learn practical and theoretical aspects of a highly skilled occupation.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

- Apprenticeship training programs require a minimum of 2,000 hours of OJT per year, supplemented by a minimum of 144 hours related classroom instruction
- Instruction may be given in a classroom, through correspondence courses, self-study, or other means of approved instruction

WHAT DO I GET?

- As an apprentice, you will receive training, education and wages from your employer
- If you qualify for a GI Bill® program, you can also collect a monthly benefit payment in addition to your regular full-time wages for the duration of the apprentice training period. The amount of the GI Bill entitlement depends on your GI Bill eligibility
- Total GI Bill benefits SMs can receive range from \$10-50K over a five-year period



- Available to full-time or part-time students
- Administered by schools participating in the Program. Check with your school's financial if your school participates

LOANS

- If you apply for financial aid, your school will likely include student loans as part of your financial aid package. Generally, there are two types of student loans—federal and private
- Federal student loans and federal parent loans: These loans are funded by the federal government
- Private student loans: These loans are nonfederal loans, made by a lender such as a bank, credit union, state agency, or a school



An incentive given upon enlistment/reenlistment to attract Soldiers to specific units, skills, or positions to meet and sustain ARNG readiness requirements.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

CATEGORIES:

- Non-prior service applicants (enlisted only); 50 or higher on ASVAB, enlist in a critical skill/unit
- Prior service applicants (enlisted only); 50 or higher on ASVAB/ AFCT, MOS qualified, E-7 or below, and enlist in an MTOE or medical unit
- Currently serving enlisted Soldiers who have completed 3 consecutive years of service, but no more than 14 total years of service, 50 or higher on ASVAB, SFC or below
- Officer commissioning programs; ROTC/SMP, OCS and WOCS
- · Currently serving officers; up to one year after commissioning

BASIC CRITERIA:

- Be eligible for the MGIB-SR/Chapter 1606 or MGIB-AD/Chapter 30
- . Complete MOS or Branch Qualification in contracted skill
- Sign a six-year service obligation (Extension/Enlistment contract or Officer Service Agreement)

WHAT DO I GET?

 Depending on your category, either \$200 or \$350 per month in addition to your basic GI Bill Payment

- After completing a Kicker contract, submit the Veterans Online Application at: www.va.gov
- Notify the School Certifying Official at your school so they can certify your enrollment.



POST-9/11 GI BILL

- If your actively participating service member has qualifying active duty, at least six years of service, and at least four years of service remaining, he/she may qualify to transfer some or all of their education benefits to their eligible dependents
- The transfer is requested by the Service Member at: https://milconnect.dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect/

STATE LICENSURE REIMBURSEMENT

- Spouses of ARNG Soldiers that were reassigned from a duty station in one state to another on or after 12 December 2017, and movement of the Soldier's dependents is authorized, qualify for up to \$500 reimbursement in qualified relicensing costs with each reassignment
- Only applies to Title 10/32 AGR/AD (IDT not authorized)

MYCAA

- The My Career Advancement Account (MyCAA) Scholarship program helps military spouses pursue licenses, credentials, or associate degrees with a specific concentration or major to pursue an occupation or career with transferable and portable skills
- MyCAA provides up to \$2k per year (up to \$4k lifetime cap)
- Soldiers must be on Title 10 active duty/AGR in the grades of E1 - E5, W1 - W2, or O1 - O2



- · Pays tuition costs up to \$250 per semester hour, up to 16 semester hours per fiscal year (1 October-30 September)
- · May be used up to a master's degree and towards an academic certificate
- · Apply online at: www.armyignited.com

STATE TUITION ASSISTANCE (STA)

- Up to 100% tuition assistance; programs vary by state














An education program that applies to veterans who served on active duty or AGR.

HOW DO I QUALIFY?

- Have qualifying active duty service on or after July 1, 1985, or AGR service after Nov 29, 1989
- Complete two years on Active Duty or AGR (Title 10/32) for 80% rate
- Complete three years on Active Duty or AGR (Title 10/32) for 100% rate. Must Complete 24 months before use
- Complete a mobilization of at least two continu-ous years (730 days), or complete 20 months of a 730 day mobilization and be discharged at the convenience of the government
- Have pay reduced by \$1,200

WHAT DO I GET?

- A monthly payment paid directly to the Soldier based on amount of active duty served.
- 3+ yrs of service = \$2,150 per month
- · 2-3 yrs of service = \$1,744 per month
- Top Up Program:
 If on active duty, you can use the MGIB-AD to pay tuition expenses not paid by TA
- Optional Plus-Up Program:
 Allows Soldiers to contribute up to an additional \$600 which will increase your monthly benefit up to \$150 per month
