# FY23 YEAR IN REVIEW







## A MESSAGE FROM THE **Virginia Lottery**

One of the most familiar visual images of lotteries is the oversized check that a person who wins a large prize receives. We've all seen photos of an incredibly lucky person posing proudly with that huge check. While we had many of those winners in Fiscal Year 2023, the biggest winner during the year was Virginia K-12 public schools, which received more than \$867 million in Virginia Lottery profits from Fiscal Year 2023.

Every school district in Virginia receives a portion of that money. You can check the list of school districts in this brochure to see how much each received, according to Virginia's Department of Education.

The \$867 million is a record, and all of us who work at the Virginia Lottery are proud of it. Those profits were generated via more than \$4.6 billion in sales. It's the first time we've had more than \$4 billion in sales in a single fiscal year.

The Lottery supports K-12 public education in other ways too through initiatives such as the acclaimed Thank a Teacher program and the sponsorship of a variety of education events across Virginia. The Virginia Lottery benefits all Virginians because the Lottery exists to benefit Virginia K-12 public education.



## **HOW DOES IT ALL WORK?**









#### Virginia Lottery Sales

With each purchase of a Lottery game, you contribute to Virginia's future and help the Lottery live its mission.

#### Lottery Proceeds Fund

The Lottery deposits 100% of profits from the sale of games into the Lottery Proceeds Fund, which is designated by the Constitution of Virginia to support local public education across the Commonwealth of Virginia.

## Virginia Department of Education

VDOE distributes all education funding, including the Lottery Proceeds Fund dollars, to school divisions across Virginia. Distribution is based on the approved state budget and other factors that include student enrollment and prioritized programs.

## Virginia's Public School Divisions

Each school division allocates funds to its schools.
