



HOW TO APPLY

- Complete the Common Application (commonapp.org) or the ApplyTexas Application (applytexas.org).
- Submit official high school transcripts, with GPA included (and college transcripts, if applicable).
- Submit official SAT or ACT scores (optional, but encouraged).⁺
- Submit the application fee or fee waiver.

- Submit official transcripts from all schools attended.
- Submit the application fee.

 Applications are accepted after the published priority date for each term, but for guaranteed consideration of admission, please submit the application and associated materials by the priority date.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

 In addition to meeting regular admissions criteria, you must submit official TOEFL test scores if you are from a nonnative English speaking country. The minimum acceptable TOEFL score is 79 on the internet-based test. For IELTS, we require a minimum score of 6.5. UTA also accepts Duolingo with a required minimum score of 100.

TRANSFERABLE

*If you apply for admission without these test scores, your application will be evaluated based on high school records such as GPA, class rank, courses taken, and other relevant criteria. However, test scores can help in determining admissions decisions, testing requirements, and scholarship opportunities.

**UTA welcomes applicants from non-ranking public or private high schools. You must meet the requirements outlined above and will be considered for admission based on individual review.

***The SAT score is calculated by combining the highest Evidence-Based Reading, Writing, and Math scores. The ACT score is the composite score, which includes the English, Reading, Math, and Science sections. UTA does not require an essay.

**** If you have 23 credit hours or less, you are considered to be a freshman student and must meet freshman and transfer admissions requirements.

*Tuition and mandatory fees are based on 30 semester hours (15 hours in the fall and 15 hours in the spring) for the 2023-24 academic year. Other course fees may apply, depending on course selection and major.

++The University has optional health insurance plans available for international students to enroll in to meet the health insurance requirements. The cost of required health insurance to cover the fall, spring, and summer semesters is \$3,438 in total.

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

To be considered for certain scholarships and financial aid opportunities, students are encouraged to apply up to a year prior to their intended start date.
