

And that's okay – because we do. All you need to do is reach out and let us know what you need – even if that's everything.








Sure, an education is important to me. But I don't want to be JUST a student. I care about other things – serving my community, making friends, having fun, helping my family, taking care of my mental health.


I don't want to take a bunch of classes that I don't need for my future. And I don't want my nose to be stuck in a textbook all the time. (Sometimes is okay.)


