General Carpenters: General carpenters provide the crucial foundation for concrete, exteriors, roofs, infrastructure, scaffolding, fine trim and finish work within the Industrial construction industries.

Floor Coverers: Floor coverers install a wide variety of flooring materials, including carpet, resilient, wood, laminates, sport surfaces, and polished concrete. UBC floor covering professionals are industry recognized experts at their craft.

Interior Systems: Interior systems carpenters specialize in assembling complex systems such as acoustical ceilings, computer-access flooring, metal framing, wall partitions, and office furniture.

Lathers: Lathers build structural frameworks for plaster and other materials, creating such wonders as theme park attractions and ornamental ceilings. Skilled lathers mostly utilize wire and metal mesh to create structures of various shapes.


Millwork & Cabinetmakers: Cabinetmakers and millworkers fabricate and install detailed decorative woodworking including trim, molding, cabinetry, doors, trade show displays, and more.

Millwrights: Millwrights install, maintain, diagnose, and repair equipment such as compressors, pumps, conveyors, gas and steam turbines, monorails, and extruders. They can be found performing mission-critical work at coal, gas, nuclear, and alternative-energy power plants.

Piledrivers: Pile drivers drive steel, concrete, or wood piling into the earth during the early stages of construction. They set up the foundation of skyscrapers, highways, bridges, solar fields, and on/off-shore wind as well as build docks and wharfs.


Residential Carpenters: The residential carpenter is an all-around carpenter with experience in nearly every aspect of residential construction. These UBC professionals install flooring, windows, doors, interior trim, cabinetry, roofing, siding, insulation, drywall, and more.

Tradeshow Carpenters: Trade show carpenters are tasked with a range of jobs including constructing and installing the exterior and interior of booths for convention exhibits as well as dismantling them.
