The pre-conference sessions will only be live and in person. They will not be available with the virtual option.

1. Al for School Counselors: Part Two – Creative, Engaging, and Evolving Tools Ali Robidoux, Ryan Robidoux, and James Burke

ABOUT THIS SESSION: Designed for all levels of AI users, will explore how rapidly evolving AI models, apps, and platforms are reshaping the counseling landscape, from engaging students in more personalized ways, to strengthening communication with families and stakeholders, to streamlining tasks that free up your time for meaningful student interactions. Participants will walk away with hands-on strategies, creative examples, and inspiration to use AI not only as a professional tool but also as a fun, dynamic way to create engaging resources. Come ready to learn, play, and discover how AI can elevate your role as a counselor, while staying grounded in the mission of supporting student success.

2. Creating a Culture of Care and Belonging through Play Howard Moody

ABOUT THIS SESSION: Play is how children engage with, explore and discover the world around them. So how can play be anything other than vitally important in a child's life. Jonathan Haidt in the book The Anxious Generation hypothesizes that as a culture and in education we have moved away from a play-based childhood, and how it has had a devastating impact on the mental health of young people of all ages. Let's explore what we can do about what we can do about it.

4. Developing a Social-Emotional Curriculum Using Student Voice Paula Brault

Is your social-emotional learning curriculum falling by the wayside? Are students and faculty complaining about needing to participate? Dr. Brault will discuss using student voice to develop curriculum that is relevant, fun to participate in, and has a combination of activities that are student requested and "must haves." Be prepared to leave the session with materials, ideas, and an action plan for your school. This is a "hands-on" workshop!

5. Master the Moment: Conference & Networking Skills for Grad Students Nicole Ward, Rachel Flagg, and Ryan Beck

Make the most of your conference experience! In this interactive session, grad students will learn how to navigate the conference with purpose, network with confidence, and practice real-world networking skills in a supportive space. Walk away with practical tips and greater confidence to connect, engage, and stand out — both during the conference and throughout your career.

6. Restorative Practices for the Equity Journey

This pre-conference session will challenge participants to engage restorative approaches as a critical pathway toward equity that is lived and not just spoken. Participants will explore restorative concepts such as the social engagement window and the fundamental hypothesis, and leave with practical strategies to build trust, strengthen relationships, respond to harm constructively, and foster inclusive learning environments where every student is seen/heard, valued and supported.

7. Walking the Line: Navigating Ethics in School Counseling with Confidence Melinda Cripps

Every decision a school counselor makes can shape a student's future—and ethical choices are often at the center. In this interactive session, we'll unpack the basics of school counseling ethics, explore the ASCA Ethical Standards, and tackle the gray areas counselors face every day. Through real-world scenarios, discussion, and peer collaboration, you'll practice applying ethical decision-making models in a safe, supportive space.

8. Classroom Management for the School Counselor

You will leave the session with proven, practical, immediately-usable techniques, strategies, and tips, some of which will bemodeled during the session, to engage students in classroom-sized lessons and facilitate any group session with confidence and enthusiasm.

ABOUT THIS SESSION: In this closing keynote, Dr. Paul Harris invites school counselors to reimagine their role in advancing equity by centering the strengths of students, families, and communities. Drawing from his antiracist strengths-based framework, Dr. Harris will share four practical ways counselors can pursue equity with clarity, purpose, and hope. Attendees will leave inspired and equipped to carry forward the equity mission with renewed energy and focus.



SPEAKER BIO: Dr. Paul C. Harris is scholar-practitioner committed to building a just world where all are seen, heard, and valued. He has 20+ years of experience as K-12 school counselor, teacher, administrator, and professor. He is currently an associate professor in the counseling and special education department at Virginia Commonwealth University. He is the former president of the Virginia School Counselor Association and formerly served on the American School Counselor Association Board of Directors. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Health & Physical Education with a concentration in Sports Medicine and his Master's degree in School Counseling from the University of Virginia, and his Ph.D. in Counselor Education from the University of Maryland. He holds a Master of Divinity degree from Virginia Union University.


