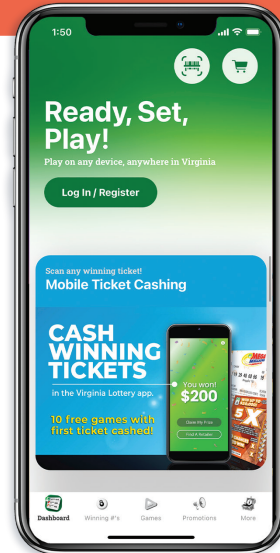

A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR **Khalid Reede Jones**

Fiscal Year 2025 (FY25) was another stellar year and one that generated \$901 million in profits for Virginia K-12 public education. Since 1999, all Virginia Lottery profits total more than \$14 billion, and 100% of that has been used to support K-12 public education in Virginia. That is something in which we at the Lottery take a lot of pride.

This brochure shows how much of that \$901 million the Virginia Department of Education distributed to each school district in Virginia. One-third of what each district receives from the Lottery goes to that district's specific needs, and two-thirds goes to programs such as School Breakfast and Early Reading Intervention.

In FY25, we celebrated a decade of our Thank a Teacher program, which is just one of the ways we honor Virginia K-12 public educators and the work they do. We also have a presence at education-related events and conferences across the commonwealth and love interacting with the educators and administrators who are the backbone of Virginia's education system.

As iLottery continues to expand in the United States, the Virginia Lottery has consistently been an industry leader. The sales of Lottery games online, along with sales of Lottery tickets at our 5,300+ valuable retailer partners, have added to the Lottery's bottom-line profits. In fact, in FY25, those retailers earned \$127.9 million in retailer compensation, and players themselves took home more than \$4.5 billion in prizes, which is the most EVER in the Lottery's history!

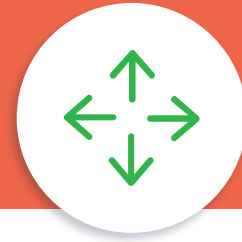
Virginia Lottery Sales

With each purchase of a Lottery game, you contribute to Virginia's future and help the Lottery live its mission.



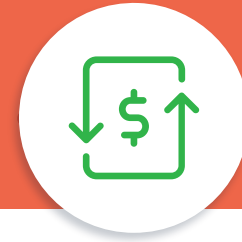
Lottery Proceeds Fund

The Lottery deposits 100% of profits from the sale of games into the Lottery Proceeds Fund, which is designated by the Constitution of Virginia to support local public education across the Commonwealth of Virginia.



Virginia Department of Education

VDOE distributes all education funding, including the Lottery Proceeds Fund dollars, to school divisions across Virginia. Distribution is based on the approved state budget and other factors that include student enrollment and prioritized programs.
