Get a jump start on your college education and enrich your high school experience through the C-N Dual Enrollment Program.

Advantages of our Dual Enrollment Program include:

- **Completion of core education courses** required at most colleges while earning high school credits
- Learn from **Christ-centered professors** who are experienced in their field
- Opportunities for **on-campus, online, and site partnership courses**
- **Access to C-N** facilities, events, and student resources
- **Automatic acceptance** for seniors applying as first-time undergraduates
- **Save hundreds of dollars** on tuition costs

Students interested in enrolling in the Carson-Newman University Dual Enrollment Program must complete the Undergraduate Admissions Process for Dual Enrollment found online at **cn.edu/dualenrollment**. Additionally, dual enrollment students must obtain permission from their high school to dual enroll at Carson-Newman.

PROGRAM & ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Students in grades 11 or 12
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) or minimum high school GPA of 2.0 with a score of 19 or higher ACT composite score
- Submission of an official high school or homeschool transcript
- Completed Dual Enrollment Application (**cn.edu/apply**)
- Completed C-N Dual Enrollment Agreement
- Proof of Residency

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How much does it cost to participate in Dual Enrollment?

\$190/credit hour | \$10/credit hour – Technology Fee

Is there Financial Aid to help cover the cost of Dual Enrollment classes?

Yes! If you're a Tennessee resident, you may qualify for the TN Dual Enrollment Grant. Eligibility requirements, award information and the application are available at collegefortn.org/dualenrollment.

How many credit hours of Dual Enrollment am I permitted to take?

At Carson-Newman, students may take up to a maximum of 14 credit hours of Dual Enrollment per semester.

What do I need to do if I want to attend Carson-Newman University when I graduate high school?

The C-N Office of Undergraduate Admissions will help you throughout this process. Students are required to submit the Admissions Application for a First-Time Undergraduate Student, available online at cn.edu/apply. Additional items (transcript and test scores) are also required. Do Dual Enrollment courses transfer to other institutions?

Carson-Newman is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and courses taken through Dual Enrollment are transferable to other accredited institutions. However, it is the decision of the Registrar's Office at the respective institution to determine how the credits will transfer and be applied. It is the responsibility of the student to contact the institution he or she plans to attend to ensure that the courses and credit hours will transfer with no discretion.
