## Beyond Burnout: 10 Leadership Strategies for Protecting Educator Mental Health

### Kat Pastor

School counseling leaders are deeply committed to supporting students, staff, and systems—but too often, that commitment comes at the expense of their own well-being. In an era of increasing demands, secondary trauma, and role overload, prioritizing mental health is no longer optional—it is a leadership imperative.

This session explores 10 practical, research-informed strategies school counseling leaders can use to protect their mental health while sustaining high-impact leadership. Participants will examine common stressors unique to counseling leadership roles and learn actionable approaches related to boundaries, mindset, workload management, relational support, and systemic self-advocacy. Designed to be immediately applicable, this session equips leaders with tools to model healthy practices for their teams while increasing personal resilience and long-term effectiveness.

#### ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Kat has passionately served as a student and educator advocate for over 20 years in the roles of coach, student council advisor, school counselor at the secondary level and financial aid counselor/coordinator of student employment and adjunct professor at the post-secondary level. Through Kat's leadership, her school counseling department received both state and national recognition, including the American School Counselors Association (ASCA) RAMP recognition in 2020. Kat has facilitated professional development with various state and national associations, along with individual schools and districts. Kat exudes a commitment to community, having served on numerous local, state and national associations, boards and committees. She holds a Bachelor of Science in Psychology, a Masters in Education in Student Affairs and School Counseling from Northern Arizona University. Kat was named the ASCA 2016 National School Counselor of the Year and Northern Arizona University's President's Alumni Awardee in 2021.

## **1. Relationships and Belonging: Why Students Struggle in Isolation, but Thrive in Connection**

### **Amy Baltimore**

Students can often appear socially integrated, but instead they feel unseen or unsafe in the learning environment. In that mindset they struggle, and sometimes, refuse to engage in learning.

This workshop introduces practical ways educators can diagnose disconnection, distinguish healthy solitude from harmful isolation, and build school-wide systems of consistent relational experiences that foster a culture of belonging.

Participants leave with simple, actionable strategies to help student brains thrive as they anticipate safety, engage in positive relational connections, and develop a readiness to learn. Dr. Amy Baltimore is a former missionary kid who grew up experiencing first-hand what it is like to serve the needs of children with deep developmental trauma. She began her career by leaning into her passion for supporting the positive growth and development of students through school counseling. As time went on, she realized the adults need just as much support as the students. So, she stepped into the role of serving as a district leader for school counseling...currently with Metro Nashville Public Schools.

Her professional experiences also include serving on the Board of Directors for the Tennessee School Counselor Association, and on advisory councils for the Tennessee Department of Education. She has been an adjunct professor and frequent speaker at various higher ed events and state conferences. She is a Nationally Board Certified Counselor and a certified trainer for Restorative Practices, Building Strong Brains (ACEs/PCEs), The 6 Pillars of Trauma-Informed Schools, and Youth Mental Health First Aid.

## 2. Repair Over Punish: Rethinking Discipline Through a Trauma Lens

### Teshia Stovall Dula

*From Consequences to Connection*

Shift from punishment to partnership. This session challenges traditional discipline methods and introduces a trauma-informed approach that focuses on connection, restoration, and understanding unmet needs.

Objectives:

- Contrast punitive and trauma-informed approaches to student behavior.
- Practice reframing behavior through the lens of unmet needs and regulation.
- Create a response flowchart for behavior incidents that prioritizes relationship repair.

#### **ABOUT THE SPEAKER**

Teshia Stovall Dula, Ed.D., began her career in school counseling in 1998 and is currently serving as a school counselor for Gwinnett County Public School System (GCPS) in Georgia. Dula also works as an adjunct professor for Grand Canyon University. She has written two books, her first published book, *STEAM for The School Counselor*, has won two awards! Dula is a proud two-time graduate of Hampton University, where Dula received her Bachelor's and Master's Degree. In 2014, she received her Specialist from Liberty University, and in 2024, conferred her doctorate. Her career awards include the 2011 Recognized ASCA Model Program Award; 2018 GCPS Writer of the Year; 2018 GSCA Writer of the Year; 2020 GCPS Middle School Counselor of the Year; 2020 GSCA School Counselor of the Year; 2022 Finalist American School Counselor of the Year. 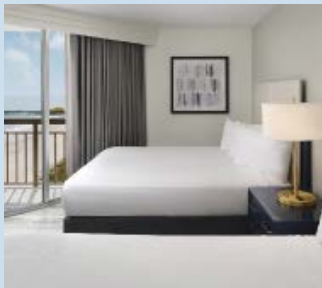
